


THURSDAY, DECEMBER 21st, AT 11:00 A.M. OR 6:30 P.M.

We were asked to share some of the reasons that we give to the ministries and outreach of St. Andrew's UMC. We were married here in the 1970's, and we began to bring our children to St. Andrew's in the 1980's. We now see our grandson growing up within the loving arms of St. Andrew's family. We have been so blessed that St. Andrew's was and is an integral part of our family, sharing the message everyone needs to hear often, God loves us, Christ saves, and the Holy Spirit guides us.

So how does this translate into the reason we give to the work that St. Andrew's does in the community?

It comes down to being the consistent light of love and grace in the everchanging world that surrounds us. The world has changed a great deal since Anne first came to St. Andrew's almost 60 years ago and it has continued to change and will continue to change dramatically in the coming years. However, the same message, given with unconditional love for each other continues to be our foundational promise to this world in such a state of chaos. St. Andrew's is a light of hope in our community and the funds we provide help us to shine brightly as a beacon for Christ. It was what attracted us to make a home for our family here, it is what attracted our children to seek out either St. Andrew's or a church family like St. Andrews in which to serve and is where our grandson is loved and mentored in the ways of Christ. Of the 10 people who ask us what we did "right" when raising the boys, our answer is always the same, we took them to church, perhaps we should add we took them to St. Andrew's.

There is so much changing in the world and how we may feel about these changes varies quite a bit, but what we do through THIS body of Christ to show a lost world the love and grace that truly matters. In the end, will make all the difference in this world and the next, is the most important reason that we give. We need to continue to adapt our approach and efforts to our community to reach those seeking Christ, but the message and love is and will remain the same as when St. Andrew's opened its doors the that first Easter Sunday many years ago. So, whether you have been here for decades like us or this is your first Sunday, it is the consistency of purpose that we support with our time, prayers, witness, talents, and treasure, and we encourage you to joining with us spreading our message that God loves us, Christ saves us, and the Holy Spirit guides us.
