

You can also watch the town hall videos for more information too. Second, I along with the church's leadership, viewable on the website, will begin conversation with the Transformation Journey coordinator Nancy Rankin and team as to next faithful steps. I recognize that questions remain. While the MAP outlines the "what," the "how" is yet to be answered. In summary, the MAP asks us to be intentional in working through a clear and defined vision for the church's ministry, how best to love, serve, and teach together in a community with multiple cultures and languages; and how we as a church can ensure that there are pathways for everyone to engage in deepening their relationship with Jesus through presence, worship, study, and service. As questions arise. I encourage you to reach out to church council members. to the staff, and to me. And please continue to hold this work in your prayers.
