



MESSAGE FROM STAFF PARRISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE:



Friends, we are in a season of change and are navigating a very new norm. With Pastor Sherri's retirement and Pastor David's transition, each of us will be asked to continue to lean into the needs of the church and community by our prayers and service. We wanted to be sure to share updates through this process.

Pastoral Appointment: We have provided our Church Profile to our District Superintendent, Dan Pezet. This

is our introduction to the council and will be used similar to a "job description" to determine the needs for St. Andrew's UMC.

Music Leader: We are preparing to post for a keyboardist/vocalist and are working towards a Music Worship Leader. In the interim, we will continue to engage with congregational singing with the choir. We may also deploy small ensembles to continue worshiping through music.

Property Manager: With the continued increase in building usage, we are preparing to post for a new position of Property Manager. This will assist with day-to-day coordination of maintenance across the property, relationships with community partners, and vendor management. We will continue to work with trustees on this position and the needs of the church.

Lastly, as our staff is managing many items, members of the SPRC will be available Sunday mornings to answer general questions. This will allow our pastoral staff the opportunity to focus on sermon preparation. Please look for one of the members to address any needs. We will be posted in the Narthex ready to serve and assist.
